NYYM Auditor Search

New York Yearly Meeting Audit Committee is beginning the process of soliciting a new auditor, and will welcome any suggestions from your Meeting or Regional Meeting of Certified Public Accounting firms that you would like to receive our initial Request for Information (RFI).

Qualified firms will be selected from those responding to the RFI, which we expect to issue in March, and those qualified firms will then receive a Request for Proposal (RFP), expected to be issued by May of this year. An annually-renewable contract, with a 5-year term, beginning in 2015, is expected to be issued by Fall of this year. The audit will cover both the Operating and Trustee Accounts of NYYM. Qualified firms will need to be capable of having a representative spend 13 days each year at the Yearly Meeting Office to carry out detailed record reviews, in addition to auditing records in electronic form.

Information on each candidate auditor should include the name and address of the firm, telephone and email address, and if possible, a point of contact and website for the firm. If your meeting or regional meeting has had any prior positive experience with the firm, or if the firm has a Quaker connection, that information would also be of interest.
